Abstract Copyright Policy

1. Assignment of Copyright

By submitting an abstract to the American Association of Neuromuscular & Electrodiagnostic Medicine (AANEM) meeting, authors agree to transfer all copyright ownership of the abstract, including all related rights, to AANEM upon acceptance and publication. This ensures the protection of intellectual property and supports the integrity of the meeting materials.

2. Rights Retention

Authors and study sponsors retain ownership of the underlying study data.

3. US Federal Employees

Abstracts prepared as part of the authors' official duties as US Federal employees are exempt from copyright transfer, as they are not subject to the Copyright Act.

4. Reuse and Acknowledgment

AANEM permits authors to reuse their presentations for educational, noncommercial purposes. Authors are free to publish their abstracts in full manuscripts or as encore presentations. Regardless of the format in which the abstract is reused (slides, posters, or any other presentation format), it must include either a copyright statement or an acknowledgment that the abstract was previously presented at the AANEM Annual Meeting, along with the appropriate year.
